

NIKOLAI KASTANAEV (1904-1937) Co-pilot / Test pilot

biography

Kastanaev was Levanevsky's right hand. Born in Moscow in 1904, he had to leave school and begin working as a machinist at 15 when his father died. His first exposure to aircraft when he became a driver at Osoaviachim flight base. When he became a Komsomol All-Union Leninist Young Communist League member in 1923 he was sent to Yegoryevsk Flight School, and upon graduation, to the Red Air Force Flight school where he became a fighter pilot. His excellent performance led to a transfer to the Air Force Research Institute where he worked as a test-pilot with light aircraft and flying boats until 1934. Starting 1935, he becomes a testpilot at the aircraft production facility and becomes involved with testing and being the first to fly the DB-A N-209. He is remembered as a very strong and
